We welcome you to Festival Mixtur 13th edition, an heterogeneous journey that defies simple categorization of new sound creation with a programme filled with artist premieres from here and all over the world, with purely sound projects and also with multidisciplinary projects.

Thus, Mixtur is connected with the territory and also with the rest of the country and the world. At the local level we particularly wish to highlight new collaborations with Difraccions cycle, Conservatori Municipal de Música de Barcelona and Escola d'Arts en Viu from Hospitalet de Llobregat. At an international level Mixtur is part of two projects financed by European Commission and Euroregion. These are Ulysses Project and RCMPM Project in cooperation with about twenty festivals from all over Europe. This enables us to bring together a variety of proposals from young artists as well as artists with extensive experience and also promote national proposals in other countries.

We would particularly like to end this overall presentation by thanking Fabra i Coats: Fàbrica de Creació, Esmuc and L'Auditori (main festival locations) and also ICEC, ICUB, INAEM and European Commission (main entities that give us support) without their commitment and support Mixtur could not continue to grow.

We would also like to thank the audience attendance and students for their participation in the festival workshops. Whether it is the first time or you know the festival already we hope you enjoy the experience, we strongly believe this will be the most resounding Mlxtur!

Alberto Bernal's recent work focuses on two lines: works in conventional spaces with audiovisual content of post-pandemic society (virtualisation, entertainment platform, functional music or accelerated information flows) and participatory projects in public space, which present a more utopian vision of the social,


highlighting the recovery of public space, reflection on the human role in nature and sensitivity beyond the screen.

In this project, the transit and friction between both realms is explored: the virtualized interior space and the shared exterior that contains it. A transit between the containment of the enclosed experience and the overflow produced by its exit into the open space. A work with a discourse in whose content is its own rupture and abandonment, giving way to the multiplicity of discourses that occur in the unpredictability of the dialogue with the specificity of the streets of Sant Andreu (Barcelona).

This activity is part of the Ulysses Project, co-financed by the European Commission, and more specifically within the framework of the InSitu/City activities, which are creation projects that explore the idiosyncrasy of each city and engage in dialogue with the urban and social environments of the city.



From Schumann to Kurtág, piano literature has been filled with great gems in miniature form. This is the case of the latest Haikus by Casablancas and the recent Albumblätter by Jarrell. They are preceded by the brief and intense Solo by Bastien David, for prepared piano. In the second part of the program, the miniatures give way to a transvestite piano, first with electronics in the Blanche Series, one of Jodlowski's first works for piano, where looping makes each layer add more intensity to an initially simple motif. And, finally, in TRAVS, where the pianist enters in a direct relationship with that percussive world that justifies the existence of his instrument. The piano is cross-dressed and merged with various percussion accessories, electronics and a MIDI electronic piano.

This conference is devoted to the writing of musical projects integrating gestures, staging, lights and visual devices (film, real-time video, stenographic images, etc.). In 1999/2000, one of my first commissions was devoted to the creation of an electroacoustic work to accompany the film "The Strike" (1924) by S. M. Eisenstein. This first experience of collision between the visual and sound medium will play a major role in

Intermezzo 4 - Silvia Rosani



Intermezzo 4 is an installation which encompasses a series of hybrid electroacoustic instruments. Metal panels vibrate through the audio feedback activated between a contact microphone applied to them and sonic exciters or speaker drivers. The resulting sound can be changed by either touching the panel or by activating 2 DC motors each connected to a speaker driver, which, hence, slides along the surface of the panel. This environment is ideal for musicians and non-musicians to create

short improvisations since one perceives the vibration of the panels as it is the case with acoustic instruments.

'Vivid Clutter' is an ongoing project between the musician pantea and the visual artists u-matic & telematique, speculating the fragile multiplicities of planetary ecologies and meta-morphoses. This builds on their previous work, and offers new trajectories for pantea's research around the river Besòs in Barcelona. This dialogue imagines fictitious living forms that might come to life under conditions of extreme environmental pollution and

scarcity, living forms in which the lines between plant, animal, and human are blurred, making it impossible to distinguish one from the other.

50 YEARS HOMAGE TO PHONOS

Festival Mixtur wants to join Phonos 50th anniversary celebrations paying tribute to this institution and to the people who founded it and kept it active to this day.

Phonos was a pioneer centre in the field of electronic and electroacoustic music in Spain. During these 50 years Phonos has worked to build bridges between sound creation and technological research, promoting and reporting on the latest technological developments from critical and creative perspectives.

It was founded in 1974 by Josep Maria Mestres Quadreny, Andrés Lewin-Richter and Lluís Callejo, Phonos was the only studio of electroacoustic music for many years in Spain. The interests of the centre were framed in pedagogical work from the outset carried out by Chilean composer Gabriel Brnčić since 1975, he met the needs of the official centres of musical education for years in the areas of electroacoustic composition in a dissemination creative side which allowed the development and promotion of this music difficult to fit into more commercial circuits.

In 1994, Phonos was linked to Pompeu Fabra University and moved to its facilities. The Phonos former director, Xavier Serra, became a professor at UPF and created the Research Group of Musical Technology (MTG), that in a few years was consolidated as an international reference group.

Phonos has been one of the venues of the festival on several occasions.

COMPOSITION AND SOUND EXPERIMENTATION WORKSHOP MIXTUR 2024

The objective of the workshop for middle and superior level students and composers on the whole, is to provide the opportunity to work during the festival with a renowned composer as well as soloists and prestigious instrumental ensembles.

General programme face to face

OTHER MIXTUR PROJECTS 2024

PEDAGOGICAL ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

One of the festival main cores since its foundation in 2012 is the educative and informative will around contemporary sound creation. Mixtur has established links and collaborations with educational institutions in Barcelona and its surroundings granting access to children and young people to this type of cultural manifestations.

Mixtur has developed some projects in close collaboration with some primary schools and intermediate level music schools that have impacted on the discovery of an unknown music reality and on children, young people and adults exploring their creativity from the sound possibilities and the means new creation offer.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

a. Mixtur at primary school

Mixtur at primary school is coordinated by pedagogue Assumpta Valls and has the objective of bringing contemporary music to children and music teachers at the Primary School stage. In order to achieve this objective, the project proposes listening to representative works of the contemporary repertoire and creating music, both activities under the guidance of the teachers, the interaction with players and the joint work and the mentoring of the guest composer. The approach to contemporary music of Primary School students is done through active listening, analysis adapted to children, movement and a creative process where children can explore and develop their own creativity.

Mixtur at Primary School encompasses three types of activities:

- > To participate in collectively creating contemporary music.
 - Students from La Sínia de Cerdanyola del Vallès school start from a piece by composer Xavier Pagès-Corella and with the help of the teacher and the composer himself they create their own pieces. The process begins with some listening work and musical analysis of one of the works by Pagès-Corella that opens the door to students to contemporary music. Work sessions with the composer and the class group are used for discussing and improving the students creations. Eventually children play their pieces within the framework of Festival Mixtur (for more detailed information see the festival programme)
 - Students from El Sagrer in Barcelona work with composer Oliver Rappoport and
 dancer Èlia Genís. Listening to one of the pieces by Rappoport serves as starting
 point for children to enter into the language of contemporary music, not only through
 listening and analysis but also through movement this time. All this process is headed
 towards the creation of a collective piece under the guidance of the teachers and the
 mentorship of the artists. The end result of this process is shown in the framework of
 Festival Mixtur (for more detailed information see the festival programme)
- Prepared attendance at a rehearsal of a contemporary piece followed by a debate with the players.

Students from different primary schools prepare the attendance at an open rehearsal with Mixtur artists during the days of the festival with the help of their teachers. In addition to listening to the pieces, when children attend the rehearsal they also interact with the players and/or the composer.

During the process of preparing the attendance at a rehearsal students carry out listening activities, analysis and sound experimentation in school guided by their music teacher. At the same time questions are being raised which will be addressed later to the players and/or composers.

During Festival Mixtur two open rehearsals will take place:

- Open rehearsal, rounds of questions and active participation from students of school El Solell de La Palma de Cervelló in the concert proposal by violist Julie Michael.
- Open rehearsal, analysis and rounds of questions on the piece Knossos by Alberto Posadas with Sidera Saxophone Quartet and students from primary school Teixidores de Gràcia.

Workshop

Workshop and talk with artist Silvia Rosani and students from primary school Turó Blau in Barcelona around her sound installation Intermezzo 4 which can be visited on the premises of Fabra i Coats during the first week of the festival. Active participation in sound exploration through directly manipulating objects that are part of the installation.

b. Mixtur at music conservatories

During Festival Mixtur composer Silvia Rosani will undertake a workshop aimed at students from Escola Superior de Música de Catalunya (ESMUC). The workshop is structured in three parts. In the first one students explore Intermezzo 4, the sound installation that Rosani will be showing in Mixtur, on which they will develop free improvisations. The second part deepens in these improvisations and the students instruments themselves will be included. The workshop will conclude with a concert within Mixtur programme where the work done will be shown (for more detailed information see the festival programme).

ACTIVITIES FOR FAMILIES

Concerts for families

Festival Mixtur 2024 includes, for the first time, the format of concerts for families within the framework of actions aimed at the creation of new audiences. Two festival guest artists, violist Julie Michael and the composer and performer Silvia Rosani, will offer two concerts specially thought for child audiences.

Julie Michael will offer a concert based on the pizzicato technique. The concert will have a brief introduction in which Michael will present different elements to children and families in relation to what they will be able to hear. After the concert the floor will be opened for questions in which the audience attending will be able to share their opinions and their experiences (for more detailed information see the festival programme).

For her part, Silvia Rosani will offer a concert with an initial presentation using the sound installation she is showing in Mixtur 2024 entitled Intermezzo 4. After the concert the attendees will be able to ask questions and share their opinions and their experience about the activity. Is also expected that children can manipulate the elements of the sound installation to make sound with them and have a direct experience with making sound (for more detailed information see the festival programme).

EUROPEAN-WIDE PROJECTS

Festival Mixtur is member of different cooperation European projects that link the festival with some of the main institutions engaged in new sound creation. Mixtur linkage with these projects makes a significant contribution to visualize the activity of the artists that participate in the festival at an international level and promotes their circulation between the different project partners.

Festival Mixtur 2021 to 2024 will take part in the **Ulysses Network** that will carry out the Ulysses Project that has the support of the European Commission within the support programme Creative Europe. This is a large-scale project that includes a multitude of activities and subprojects and provides several partnerships between institutions involved in order to offer young artists (players, composers and conductors) the opportunity to participate.

The institutions involved with Ulysses Project together with Festival Mixtur are: Institut de Recherche et Coordination Acoustique/Musique - IRCAM (France), Divertimento Ensemble (Italy), Gaudeamus (Netherlands), Impuls (Austria), International Ensemble Modern Academy, Hochschule für Musik und Theater Hamburg (Germany), Fondation Royaumont (France), Time of Music (Finland), Festival Ultima (Norway) and Warsaw Autumn (Poland).

The activities included in the project that have been carried out during those four years are as follows:

- Replay Cultural Heritage and Young Audiences: organization of pedagogical activities, especially targeting children with the aim to create new audiences.
- Commissions to young composers: for young composers. The commissioned works are played in different festivals from Red Ulysses.
- Young Ensembles: invitation to European emerging instrumental ensembles to various events organized by each member of Red Ulysses.
- Ulysses Ensemble: instrumental ensemble formed by young players that carry out an international tour to different festivals from Red Ulysses.
- Ulysses Journeys: young artists selected within this programme will be invited by the different Red Ulysses members to attend pedagogical activities.
- Collaborative Creation Projects: projects like Collaboratory and InSitu City propose different formulae of joint work between artists with the goal of creating pieces related to the city and the surroundings in which it takes place.
- Ulysses Network Associate Partners: the project partners create additional partnerships with European institutions that are programming and giving support to young artists in the field of sound creation. Ulysses partner entities take up works and entire concerts created by or/and with the participation of selected young artists within the framework of Ulysses activities.

InSitu City

Composer and multidisciplinary artist Alberto Bernal, Frames Percussion ensemble (recently awarded by Ernst von Siemens Foundation with its prestigious prize for ensembles) and a group of students from the School of Performing Arts of El Prat de Llobregat and from the Municipal Conservatory of Music of Barcelona will take part in a joint creation project: a new musical composition from within 30 minutes duration which involves an intervention of public space, something common in Bernal's work.

Festival Mixtur welcomes artists who incorporate sound exploration into their work. This openness is expressed through a biannual open call, which determines a very important part of the programme to come.

With a total of 659 applications received for the last open call and the selection of 171 proposals from its beginning in 2012, Mixtur Open Call has established itself as one way to publicize projects around the world, of high artistic level.

ARIADNA ALSINA

Ariadna first studied violin and sonology and focused on composition, guided by L. Naón at ESMUC. In Paris, she studied with J. M. López López, H. Vaggione, Ch. Groult, H. Parra, M. Matalon. She joined the Cursus at Ircam and the Master in Mixed Music Composition at the Haute École de

Musique de Genève (P. Dusapin, L. Naón and M. Jarrell). She completed a doctorate on the writing of time in mixed music at the University of Paris-8. She works in her compositions with the malleability and transformation of sound material and carries out constant research about timbre.



ALBERTO BERNAL

ALBERTO BERNAL. Composer and sound artist of classical formation and several influences, with works framed near the turning point between traditional concert situations and other disciplines like installation, performance of videoart. His work is, above all, a search and deconstruction

of borders: between the aesthetic and sociopolitical realms, or between the different conventional perceptual fields (sound, image, word, quotidian perception). Since 2023 he is professor at the Royal Conservatory of Madrid.



BLACK PAGE ORCHESTRA

BLACK PAGE ORCHESTRA es un ensemble fundado en Viena en 2014 dedicado a la música radical y sin concesiones de nuestros tiempos. El conjunto toma su nombre del tema "The Black Page" de Frank Zappa, conocido por su complejidad rítmica y su textura densa. Durante sus 10 años

de existencia, Black Page Orchestra ha establecido importantes impulsos estéticos en la escena musical vienesa y ha presentado por primera vez al público local a numerosos compositores cuyas obras se encuentran en la intersección entre la música, la tecnología y el arte multimedia. Además de realizar numerosos conciertos como ensemble invitado (Märzmusik Berlín, Otoño de Varsovia, PAN Seúl, Wien Modern, entre otros), desde 2020 Black Page Orchestra también tiene su propia serie de conciertos en el Musikverein de Viena.



MATTEO CESARI

Matteo Cesari (b. 1985, Bologna, Italy) is a dynamic artist and researcher specializing in contemporary music interpretation. With a distinguished career worldwide, he earned his doctoral degree with honors from the University Paris IV. Cesari collaborates with esteemed composers, performs globally with renowned orchestras, and shares his expertise through international masterclasses. He recently released a comprehensive recording of Salvatore Sciarrino's solo flute works for Kairos, showcasing his profound influence on contemporary music.



AGUSTÍ CHARLES

Born in Manresa, he began his musical studies at an early age. His first works in musical composition date back to the 1980s, with the help of Miquel Roger, Albert Sardà and Josep Soler. Later he studied with Franco Donatoni, Luigi Nono and Samuel Adler, in addition to working with Joan

Guinjoan, Cristóbal Halffter, J.R. Encinar and Ros Marbà, among others. He has a Doctor in Art History and Professor of Composition at the Aragón Superior Conservatory of Music. He currently teaches composition at the Higher Conservatory of Music of Aragon and at the Higher School of Music of Catalonia.



AMIDEA CLOTET

Amidea Clotet (Málaga, 1997) is one of the emerging figures of the generative improvisation scene in Barcelona. She studied electric guitar at the Liceu conservatory, as well as a year of contemporary composition in Denmark, where she began to find her way with improvisation.

Creating spontaneous soundscapes through extended techniques and objects, raw music that emerges as a response to the times we live in; a dual game between a risky sound experimentation opposed to the beauty of the subtle.



VICTOR DE LA ROSA

Committed to contemporary music, he has premiered more than 50 works by composers from around the world, playing at festivals such as the Sampler Series, the Geneva Archipel, Huddersfield Festival, Lucerne Festival, Éclat de Stuttgart, the ENSEMS or the VANG. In 2014 he replaced acclaimed

bass clarinetist Harry Sparnaay in Gerard Pape's opera "Why Poets" in the role of soloist alongside Nicholas Isherwood and John Kenny. Likewise, he is a founding member of the CrossingLines ensemble. As a soloist he has played with the OBC, OCM and the One Tree Hill Sinfonia. Since 2014 he has been a clarinet professor at the Superior Conservatory of the Balearic Islands.



CONTAINER ENSEMBLE

CONTAINER Ensemble takes its concerns to the international scene, reflecting in its programmes the latest artistic creation and experimentation in the musical and visual fields. They have been active in different European countries, establishing its main base in Basel. Among its

programmes, highlights include Gesture as sonority, where Black Box Music by Simon Steen Andersen was premiered; All the defects of the human being with Generation Kill by the Belgian composer Stefan Prins; as well as premieres by Johannes Kreidler, Lara Stanic and collaborations with Cathy van Eck.



CHAYA CZERNOWIN

Through her constantly evolving work and radical, original musical language, Chaya Czernowin makes existential themes tangible for the audience while maintaining a common thread throughout. Her diverse oeuvre includes four operas, orchestral and chamber works, with and without

electronics. Czernowin was composer in residence at the Salzburg Festival (2005/6), Lucerne Festival (2013), and Huddersfield Festival (2021). She has taught composition at UCSD, was the first woman composition professor at the University for Music and Performing Arts Vienna, and at Harvard University, where she teaches since 2009.



DECODER ENSEMBLE

The Decoder Ensemble, founded in 2011 in Hamburg, is an innovative band for contemporary music. This six-member group, consisting of electronic and acoustic instruments, stands out from traditional chamber music with its energetic, distinctive sound. They blend instrumental music, multimedia,

staging, and physical performance, constantly exploring new forms of expression beyond genre boundaries. Decoder regularly performs at Germany and international festivals, and since 2017, they are the Ensemble in Residence for the "Unterdeck" concert series at Elbphilharmonie Hamburg. They have released two CDs on Wergo and Ahornfelder and are featured in the ULYSSES Network project for 2022-2024.



ENSEMBLE SILLAGES

Ensemble Sillages, founded in 1992 by Philippe Arrii-Blachette, is a group of musicians dedicated to exploring the frontiers of musical creation. Led by Argentinian composer and conductor Gonzalo Bustos since 2020, the Ensemble is based at Quartz in Brest and performs throughout France

and internationally. They work in close collaboration with contemporary composers, striving to reach diverse audiences in a spirit of accessibility and sharing. They also organize the Electrocution festival, focused on new technologies and musical innovation.



FRAMES PERCUSSION

FRAMES Percussion represents the talent and dedication to contemporary music. Comprising a new generation of percussionists from Spain, the group emerged with the purpose of presenting the most unique and innovative proposals, encompassing the most challenging pieces in the

current repertoire. Their approach involves meticulous preparation and utmost respect for new compositional languages.

After receiving support from national institutions such as ICEC, INAEM, ICUB and IRLL, in 2024, they have been awarded the pretigious Ernst von Siemens Ensemble Prize '24.



IRENE GALINDO

Granada, 1985. Irene Galindo Quero studied in Freiburg and Cologne. Since 2012 learns sarod with Pandit Brij Narayan. 2014-16 taught composition at the CSMA Aragón. Her work has been recognised with numerous awards: Berlin-Rheinsberger Kompositionspreis, Kompositionspreis der

Landeshauptstadt Stuttgart, Brahmshaus Baden-Baden, Residencia de Estudiantes Madrid. She has received commissions from the Deutsche Oper Berlin, Concertgebouw Brugge, Wittener Tage für Neue Kammermusik, Staatsoper Hamburg, Philharmonie Luxembourg. She works regularly with the poet Ángela Segovia. Lives in Berlin.



ÈLIA GENÍS

Elia Genís. Graduated in Choreography and Interpretation by the Institut del Teatre in Barcelona and certified in the Feldenkrais Method by EuroTab. Interested in the link between movement arts and education, oriented towards contemporary creation in non-conventional spaces. She has

collaborated with artists such as Luis Tabuenca and Noriko Koshida in "Dreamtime" and "Ecologías disruptivas". Is part of the company Magdalena Garzón with the piece "Altars profans". She works in somatic education and creative processes, collaborating with various institutions, with an upcoming premiere for children at Mercat de les Flors in 2025.



ELISABETH HARNIK

Austrian pianist and composer Elisabeth Harnik has a multifaceted work in improvised music, interdisciplinary projects, and contemporary composition. She studied classical piano and composition with Beat Furrer at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Graz. As an

improviser, she is inspired by electro-acoustic sound, using preparations and extended techniques to push the piano's limits. Her performances combine physicality, introspection, intuition, and precision. She works internationally with renowned contemporary jazz musicians like Joëlle Léandre, Ken Vandermark and Harri Sjöström. CD releases document her compositional and pianistic activities.



MICHAEL JARRELL

Michael Jarrell studied composition in Eric Gaudibert's class at the Geneva Conservatory, in addition to several stays in the United States (Tanglewood, 1979). He completed his training at the Staatliche Hochschule für Musik in Freiburg im Breisgau, with Klaus Huber. Since 1982, his work has

received numerous awards: "Prix Acanthes" (1983), "Beethovenpreis" de la Ville de Bonn (1986), "Prix Marescotti" (1986), "Gaudeamus" and "Henriette Renië" (1988), Siemens-Förderungspreis (1990).



PANTEA, U-MATIC & TELEMATIQUE

Pantea's work focuses on narratives of ecological connection through writing, music, and socially-engaged practice. They are co-directing So in collaboration with Soundcamp and co-facilitating Khamoosh, a community dedicated to preserving and archiving Iranian sonic heritage.

The artist duo, u-matic & telematique create live performances, video installations, and workshops entailing interactive stage sets and VR. Their work explores intangible concepts by creatively engaging with different senses of time, processes of digital creation, and transformations of errors into content.



PIERRE JODLOWSKI

Pierre Jodlowski is a composer, sound artist, improviser and performer in the field of contemporary music, electroacoustic, jazz and rock scenes. His work is at the crossroads of those genres and leads him to collaborate with different artists, musicians, dansers, stage managers

and video artists. His projects are performed in Europe and all around the world in the contemporary art network. He is currently living in both France and Poland.



ALEXANDER KHUBEEV

Alexander Khubeev (born 1986) graduated from Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory in 2011, won awards in Argentina, Italy, Kazakhstan, Netherlands, Russia, Ukraine, USA including prestigious Gaudeamus Prize (Utrecht, 2015). He received scholarships from Darmstadt Summer Courses

(2014) and Berlin Academy of Arts (2018). His music is played in concerts held in more than 30 countries around Europe, Asia, South and North America. He is artistic director of Tchaikovsky Young composers Academy and co-founder and curator of Composition course reMusik.org. Since 2023 he lives and works in Paris.



JULIE MICHAEL

Violist Julie Michael strives to bring the same spirit of sincerity to the performance of music of all eras, for all audiences. A passionate interpreter of new music, Julie has collaborated with many composers to premiere new solo viola and chamber works. Julie has performed throughout Europe

and North America as former violist of the Tana Quartet, and through guest appearances with ensembles including lctus, Alarm Will Sound and Ensemble Intercontemporain. An engaging performer for young audiences, Julie regularly gives concerts and workshops at schools and children's festivals.



JORDINA MILLÀ I BARRY GUY

Jordina Millà is a pianist and improviser based in Austria. Nowadays free improvised music, contemporary language and multidisciplinar scenarios are her main interest. In spring 2018 she debuted with her Solo album "Males herbes". "When forests dream" a two pianos album with Agusti

Fernández, has been awarded by Enderrock de les Illes Balears, for the best Jazz album 2020

Barry Guy is an innovative bass player and composer. He is founder and Artistic Director of the London Jazz Composers Orchestra and the BGNO (Barry Guy New Orchestra) for which he has written several extended works. In 2014 he founded the "Blue Shroud Band" to perform his composition "The Blue Shroud" based on Picasso's painting "Guernica" with texts by the Irish poet Kerry Hardie.

Together they have released the duo album "String Fables".



LUIS NAÓN

Born in 1961, in La Plata (Argentina). Musical studies at the University of La Plata, Buenos Aires then at the CNSMDP with Guy Reilbel, Laurent Cuniot, Daniel Teruggi, Sergio Ortega and Horacio Vaggione. PhD in Esthétique at Paris 8. Professor of Composition and Computer Music at the

CNSMDP since 1991. He became a professor of Composition at The ESMuC in 2002 and Professor in the HEM de Genève since 2006. His last work is "Joyas" (Diagonal & Rut Schereiner) for "Création Mondiale". His works are edited by Henry Lemoine, Gérard Billaudot and BabelScores.



ISANDRO OJEDA

The composer, improviser and multimedia artist Isandro Ojeda-García -Seville, 1989- is interested in written or improvised music, experimental poetry, video installation and the construction of sound-creating objects. A singular voice, always hunting for sources of artistic material and a

generation of aesthetics. His work is born from setting to the limit systems and numerical devices with potential to configure an hybrid imaginary of strongness.



ALBERTO POSADAS

Alberto Posadas, a student of Francisco Guerrero, explores in his work the relationship between music and nature, mathematics and other artistic disciplines. He developed "generative microinstrumentation" to obtain musical material from microscopic resources of instruments.

He won the audience award at Ars Musica (Brussels, 2002) and the Spanish National Music Award (2011). He has been composer in residence at Ircam on several occasions, at the Internationales Künstlerhaus Villa Concordia in Bamberg (2014) and at the Wissenschaftskolleg in Berlin (2016/17).



PULVERIZE THE SOUND

Pulverize the Sound was formed in the intensely collaborative, hybridized, prolific and promiscuous DIY scene of NYC experimental music. Its members have played with musicians and bands from a huge variety of scenes, always remaining peripheral to any definable

genre. Collectively, they have worked with Lydia Lunch, Evan Parker, Frank Lowe, Mary Halvorson, among others. In more than a decade of constant rehearsal and performance, PTS has explored a wide range of original music from delicate chamber music to modernist composition and free improvisation. PTS's third release BLACK is their first fully improvised album, issued by Relative Pitch in November of 2022.



RIOT ENSEMBLE

Shortlisted for the 2024 Royal Philharmonic Society Ensemble Award, London-based Riot Ensemble connects audiences to contemporary music through innovative concerts and events. The members of Riot work as performers, curators, commissioners, and collaborators,

creating and producing diverse projects. Since 2012, they've premiered 250+ works by composers from 35+ countries. Riot usually looks for long-term, lasting impact collaborations, and performs internationally regularly. Their extensive discography includes acclaimed releases like "Speak Be Silent" and "Vestige." Supported by various foundations, Riot continues to push boundaries in music.



ALBERTO ROSADO

From Schumann to Kurtág, piano literature has been filled with great gems in miniature form. This is the case of the latest Haikus by Casablancas and the recent Albumblätter by Jarrell. They are preceded by the brief and intense Solo by Bastien David, for prepared piano, and the premiere of the

miniature by the young Finnish Tara Jovana Valkonen. In the second part of the program, the miniatures give way to a transvestite piano, first with electronics in the Blanche Series, one of Jodlowski's first works for piano, where looping makes each layer add more intensity to an initially simple motif. And, finally, in TRAVS, where the pianist enters in a direct relationship with that percussive world that justifies the existence of his instrument. The piano is cross-dressed and merged with various percussion accessories, electronics and a MIDI electronic piano.



SILVIA ROSANI

Silvia studied composition at Mozarteum Universität and completed a degree in electronic engineering. She holds a PhD from Goldsmiths, University of London, where she has worked as Associate Lecturer. Silvia was in residence at Akademie Schloss Solitude, the HCl in Salzburg, ZKM,

the Experimental Studio of the SWR and at RIXC through the EMAP/EMARE platform. She was awarded the Hannsmann-Poethen Literaturstipendium along with poet Kinga Tóth for Electrical Jungle, a multimedia music theatre piece. Silvia teaches electronic music composition at the Conservatoire Guido Cantelli.



ALEXANDER SCHUBERT

Alexander Schubert (1979) studied bioinformatics and multimedia composition and is a professor at Musikhochschule Hamburg. Through music composition, immersive installations, and staged pieces, he explores the border between the acoustic and electronic world, digital

and analogue. His work questions perception and representation, focusing on authenticity, virtuality, and the influence of digital media from a post-digital perspective. Recent topics include virtual reality, AI, and online-mediated artworks. Schubert is a founding member of ensembles like "Decoder," with his works performed over 700 times in 30+ countries.



SIDERA SAXOPHONE QUARTET

The SSQ was founded in 2020 with the aim of enriching and disseminating the contemporary and experimental repertoire for this ensemble, spanning from historical modernity to the most recent works, also with electronics. The Quartet has performed in important festivals such as

Nuova Consonanza, Angelica in Bologna, Amici della Musica di Modena, Area Sismica. They collaborated with different composers among which Sciarrino and C. E. Cella. In 2022 they recorded their first cd including the first ever recording of music by Antonioni, Bussotti, Ceccarelli, Doati, Scodanibbio and Solbiati.



VASCO TRILLA

Known for his imagination, cross-genre experience and the constant search for expanding the limits of his instrument, Vasco Trilla (born in Barcelona with Portuguese origins) is one of the most active, versatile and creative drummers of the european scene. He has recorded more than 100

albums, 6 solo, ranging from free improvisation, jazz and rock to metal and ambient music. Following international touring and collaborations with Jamaaladeen Tacuma, Ra Kalam Bob Moses, Mars Williams, Patrick Shiroishi or Susana Santos Silva among many others, he has established himself as one of the leading voices of creative percussion.



CAROLIN WIDMANN

Carolin Widmann has studied in Cologne, Boston and London. She won numerous awards such as 'Artist of the Year' at the ICMA classical music awards, Schneider-Schott Preis of the City of Mainz and the Bavarian State Prize for her contribution to the Arts. She has played with Berliner

Philharmoniker, Symphonieorchester des Bayerischen Rundfunks, London Philharmonic, Orchestre de Paris, Czech Philharmonic, Los Angeles Philharmonic, National Orchestra of Spain, and Sydney Symphony Orchestra under conductors like Sir Simon Rattle, Riccardo Chailly, Esa-Pekka Salonen, Vladimir Jurowski and Edward Gardner.
